KMX Karts are bringing a new revolution to cycling in the U.S. Combining the ruggedness of mountain bikes with the daring, rebellious look and performance of BMX, KMX (Kart Moto Cross) Karts offer retailers an exciting new way to reach extreme sports enthusiasts and others who want to experience a radical, new twist to off-road and trail riding.

Created by KMX Karts, Ltd. of Britain, the tadpole-style trikes are **now available in** the States through KMX America. Engineered for agile performance and stability, they come in two models: one sized for kids (K Class) and one for adults (X Class).

KMX also offers a growing selection of accessories to adapt the karts for touring.

While building trikes for his and daughter, son aerospace engineer Barry Smith developed KMX's unique look and design. In 2002 he and friend Alan Smith took two prototypes to a National Bike Week event in Portsmouth, England. Although the Smiths weren't officially

invited vendors, their karts created a real stir among the many kids who gave them a spin. Riding on that successful debut, Barry and Alan became business partners and launched KMX Karts in July 2002.

KMX Karts are made tough and versatile to meet the demands of all types of riders:

- Their three-point stability makes them as **suitable for persons with disabilities and balance issues** as those who want to push the karts to the limit."The disability just seems to disappear, because they're riding something that every other kid on the street would like to own," explains Alan Smith, KMX Karts director.
- They provide an excellent aerobic workout for those who cycle for fitness.
- The karts adapt for on-road touring with accessories, such as lightweight wheel sets. And more accessories are on the way!

To capitalize on the youthful zeal for their new product, the Smiths originally marketed only the children's K Class model. Kids, they reasoned, were more apt to jump on the new sensation than adults who might hang back due to preconceived notions that recumbent bikes and trikes are for reserved, less active individuals.

The kids – spinning out, whipping around, and performing tricks on the cool-looking karts, all the while grinning ear to ear – quickly destroyed any such notion. The fact that the KMX is a recumbent-style trike didn't matter to them. What mattered is rather simple – KMX is fun!

Rob Gentry, who sells KMX at his shop, Recumbent Bike Riders, Inc. in State College, Pennsylvania, said that when parents saw their kids jumping curbs and "rutting around" off road on their KMXs, they wished "they had one just like it. They would ask me, 'When are you getting one for adults?'"

We designed the KMX primarily for people who are into BMX, skateboarding, inline skating, mountain biking or any other extreme activity," explains Barry Smith. "These people have the ideal mental attitude for getting the best from their KMX."

He adds that **most KMX customers have never before ridden a recumbent bike or trike.** "This introduces thousands of people to trikes that would not previously have even looked at one."
